On a beautiful Sunday afternoon, volunteers from Friends of Bear Creek Stables readied an information table with postcards, sign-up sheets, and fliers. As part of our fundraising campaign, we greeted the public at Bear Creek Redwoods Preserve and described the diverse educational programs we plan to offer at the stables. Our vision includes programs such as docent-led nature walks, journaling, painting, school and senior group field trips, teen volunteering, equine therapy, small animal co-ops, lectures on environmental sustainability, and more. The park visitors that stopped by were enthusiastic at the prospect of having a new part of the preserve open for learning about nature, horses, history, and communing with like-minded people.

On this afternoon, a father and son approached the table. Our volunteers explained that three horses would be coming up to the table from the stables nestled in the preserve. When we asked the boy if he had seen a horse before, he answered "Yes!" After thinking for a few moments, he added, "But only in books."
